**Subject: - Fixation of fee for B.Pharmacy Course for the session 2026-27.**

On consideration of your fee proposal for the B.Pharmacy Course for the academic session 2026-27, the Admission and Fee Regulatory Committee has approved the fee structure for the B.Pharmacy Course from the academic session 2026-27 onwards. The fee structure for the B.Pharmacy Course for the academic session 2026-27 is as follows:-

Tuition Fee (per annum)	Rs. 64,100/-
Development Fee (per annum)	Rs.9,600/-
<b>Total</b>	<b>Rs. 73,700/-</b>

The Committee also fixes the students fund and caution money as follows:-

Student fund per student per year	Caution money-college (one time only) refundable	Caution money Hostel/Mess (one time from Boarders/hostellers only) refundable
<b>Rs.4500/-</b>	<b>Rs.4500/-</b>	<b>Rs.4500/-</b>

The institute will charge this fee from the students who will take admission in B. Pharmacy course for the academic session 2026-27 and all the old students in the institute shall be charged the fee payable by them at the time of their admission.

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In addition to the above fee, the institute may charge the University examination fee on actual basis against receipt. Other university charges / funds have been considered while fixing fee, as such, the institute shall not charge any other university fee/fund from students.

The above decision is conveyed for your information and necessary action. The detailed excerpt of the meeting concerning your fee proposal is separately enclosed to apprise you as to how your fee proposal has been dealt by the Committee.

The fee is subject to the terms and conditions/guidelines mentioned in **Annexure 1 & 2**. The institute will also follow the guidelines already issued by this Committee from time to time.

You are requested to reflect the above fee in the prospectus and also on Website of your institute and submit a copy of the prospectus, when published, to the Admission and Fee Regulatory Committee for record.



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**Excerpt from Minutes of Admission & Fee Regulatory Committee, Haryana meeting dated 03.12.2025 concerning the proposal for fixation of fee for B.Pharmacy Course for the academic session 2026-27 of L.N. College of Pharmacy, Village- Madhogarh, District- Mahendergarh**

L.N. College of Pharmacy, Mahendergarh has submitted the proposal for fixation of fee for B.Pharmacy Course for the academic session 2026-27. The proposal was analysed by the Chartered Accountant (Member) of A&FRC, Haryana and he submitted his report proposing tuition fee as Rs.64100/- and Development Fund Rs.9600/- (Total Rs.73700/-). The analysis report was considered by this Committee, in its meeting held on 19.11.2025 and it was decided that before taking final decision in the matter, opportunity be given to Private Technical Educational Institutions, Parents/Guardians and representatives of the students already studying in aforesaid institutes to give their written submissions as per provision of Section 17 (2) of 2012 Act. It was further decided that the notice be also given to all concerned through publication in one English newspaper and one Hindi newspaper having Circulationin Haryana. The institute concerned was written a letter to express their view points in writing with respect to the determination of fee. Copy of the analysis report was also supplied to the institute with the request to place notice, for information to the parents/guardians and representatives of the students studying in the institute, on the notice board and also the website of the institute with copy of analysis report. The institute was requested to permit its students their representative/parents/guardians to inspect the analysis report in its office during working hours and to apprise this office of compliance in this regard within 7 days of receipt of letter. Notice with analysis report was also displayed on website of the committee.

It was also apprised in the notice that, for personal hearing in the matter interested person/party may appear in the office of committee on 03.12.2025. The letter vide Memo No. 833/A&FRC dated 21.11.2025 was sent to the institute seeking compliance of letter to place analysis report & notice on notice board, its website and to supply the view point of the Institute/Parents/Guardians/Representative of the students, if submitted, to this office upto 28.11.2025.

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The Institute has supplied the requisite information vide e-mail dated 26.11.2025. The Principal, L.N. College of Pharmacy, Mahendergarh has informed that the analysis report of C.A., Member A&FRC and notice has been displayed on the notice board as well as website of the institute. No view points have been received from the parents, guardians or representative of the students. The Principal, L.N. College of Pharmacy, Mahendergarh has informed that the institute has not to file any objections to the analysis report submitted in this case. The Notice was also got published in newspaper "Dainik Jagran" and "The Tribune" on 22.11.2025.

To give an opportunity of personal hearing, the institute was asked to attend today's meeting of the Committee held through virtual mode. The institute intimated that its authorized representative Sh. Sunil Kumar, Principal and Sh. Naveen, CA will attend the meeting.

Sh. Naveen, CA have joined the meeting held today i.e. on 03.12.2025 on behalf of the institute and has submitted that the fee computed in the analysis report is acceptable to the institute.

In the fee proposal, the institute sought the fixation of tuition fee for the academic session 2026-27 as Rs.70000/- and Development Fund Rs.12000/- (Total Rs. 82000/-). On calculation as per financial statements and expenses chart supplied by the institute, the tuition fee for B.Pharmacy Course was computed as Rs.64100/- and Development Fund Rs.9600/- (Total Rs.73700/-). While computing the fee for the academic session 2026-27 onwards, the hike in the expenses of faculty and other operational expenses including payment of affiliation / registration fee and other funds to the universities has been taken in to consideration.

Resolved that keeping in view the submission of the institute, the committee is of the opinion that the fee proposed in the analysis report dated 07.11.2025 submitted by Sh.Ved Parash Narang, Chartered Accountant , Member, be allowed to the institute for B.Pharmacy Course for the academic session 2026-27 onwards.

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The committee accept this report and fix the fee for B.Pharmacy course of L.N. College of Pharmacy, Mahendergarh for the academic session 2026-27 onwards as follows:-

In addition to the above fee, the institute may charge the University examination fee on actual basis against receipt. Other university charges / funds have been considered while fixing fee, as such, the institute shall not charge any other university fee/fund from students.

As per the Section 11.3 of the Haryana Private Technical Educational Institution (Regulation of Admission and Fee) Act, 2012 "The fee structure so determined by the Committee shall be binding on the private technical educational institution for a period of three years and the same fee shall continue further if the private technical educational institution does not approach the Committee for revision". The institute will charge this fee from the students who will take admission in B. Pharmacy course for the academic session 2026-27 and all the old students in the institute shall be charged the fee payable by them at the time of their admission.

The development fee shall be treated as capital receipt and shall be collected only if the institution maintains "Depreciation Reserved Fund" for equivalent depreciation charges in the revenue charges account. Provision of Section 19.2 of The Haryana Private Technical Educational Institution (Regulation of Admission and Fee) Act, 2012 be brought to the notice of the institute which reads as follows:-

**Section 19-2**"A private technical educational institution may charge development fee not exceeding fifteen percent of the total amount of tuition fee. The development fee shall be treated as capital receipt and shall be collected only if the institution maintains the "Depreciation Reserve Fund" equivalent to the depreciation charges in the revenue.

### **Terms and Conditions**

#### **Terms and Conditions regulating fee for technical courses in private technical educational institutions for academic session 2026-27 onwards.**

1. The fee shall be collected semester-wise at the time of start of semester and not for entire year.
2. Faculty shall be recruited as per AICTE/PCI/Council of Architecture or any other regulatory body (as applicable) Norms and pay scales/DA as approved by regulatory body (above) shall be given which shall be seen by State Fee Committee at the end of every financial year. If any faculty positions is found vacant or at less pay and perks, the proportionate amount may be recovered by the Admission and Fee Regulatory Committee and utilized for scholarships for weaker section students. The Institute shall submit statement to this effect by January end each year.
3. Every penny collected from students, whatsoever, and in any form, shall be well accounted for. The head-wise account shall be separately maintained and included in college/ institution accounts. No diversion of fund from the institution shall be made. The Institutions shall submit the audited balance sheet up to 30<sup>th</sup> September of every year to the Admission and Fee Regulatory Committee.
4. The Freeships/scholarships, if any, shall be inclusive in Tuition fee.
5. The Society/Trust expenditure shall not be claimed in the Institution. The account of institution shall be separate from the account of Society/Trust.
6. The faculty status shall be updated in mandatory disclosures every month on website of the Institute.
7. Institutions are free to earn up to 5% of receipts through extra professional and academic activities such as short term and long term courses, training, consultancies, R & D projects, Placement activities etc. The funds so generated shall be utilized in establishing a corpus fund to take care of the staff development, student welfare, infrastructural development and any unforeseen expenses etc. (Separate account shall be maintained for receipts, expenditure and transfer of surplus to corpus fund).
8. Mandatory disclosures on format prescribed by AICTE or any other regulatory authority like PCI/Council of Architecture shall be updated by all the institutions from time to time and displayed on its website.
9. Against Capital investment, sufficient investment must be from corpus.
10. A copy of Guidelines issued by the Admission and Fee Regulatory Committee regarding charging of different amounts under various heads other than Tuition Fee, Development Fund, Student Fund, Caution Money is attached.

## **Guidelines**

**Guidelines regarding charging of different amounts under various heads other than Tuition Fee, Development fund, Student fund, Caution Money for academic session 2026-2027 onward.**

1. **Hostel & Mess charges:**  
Maximum ₹3000/- per month per student for ordinary room and maximum ₹3500/- per month for A.C. Room per student.  
Mess Charges will be as per actual. The rates of meals and other items will be displayed at the gate of the mess and also inside the mess.  
Boarding and lodging shall include water & electricity, reading room, computer centre, gym and sports/necessary furniture & furnishings. However there can be a variation of 10% depending upon locale and specific demands.  
Laundry and Canteen etc shall be on actual basis and optional.
2. **Transport:-** It has to be as per actual, however not beyond Govt. fare per K.M. + up to 50%.
3. **University/Board and Examination fee-** As per actual.
4. **Prospectus:-** only once in the course and should not be more than Rs.1000/-.
5. **Placement Brochure:-** Chargeable only once (in final year) and should not be more than Rs.750/-.
6. **Insurance:-** Actual basis.
7. **Uniform:-** If prescribed and supplied by the institute /university Rs.6000/- which shall include one Blazer, two trousers, two shirts, one tie, two socks. Other requirements, if any shall be optional and chargeable.

**Every institute is required to fix all the charges accordingly and reflect in their prospectus & on their website and must necessarily submit a copy of prospectus and placement brochure to Admission and Fee Regulatory Committee before start of Admission process every year.**
